





How and why do we upscale climate services?

What is upscaling?

Upscaling is the process of moving beyond pilots or prototypes to repeatable and/or transferable services that are useful and accessible to stakeholders and users. It also includes enhancing existing services to increase reach and impact. In the scaling literature the term 'innovation' is often used to refer to what is being scaled.

Types of climate service upscaling

Upscaling climate services is a task which needs special attention, requiring considerations beyond academic interest, and/or traditional marketing and business strategies.

HORIZONTAL

Providing innovations for more users, sectors or geographical areas.



VERTICAL

Enhancing uptake by creating institutional change and an external enabling environment.





FUNCTIONAL


Adding new functions/elements to the service to increase reach and impact.
