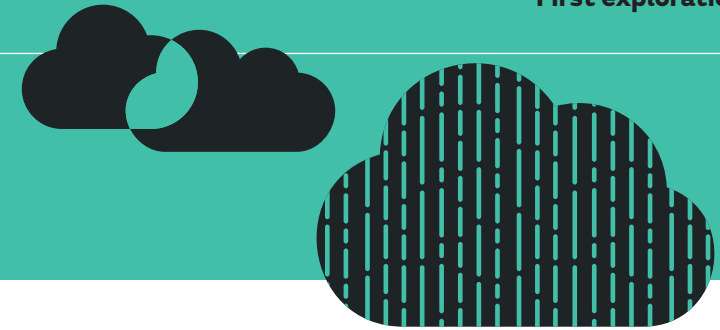


# P4C questions and stimuli
